

SAFETY ALERT

Do you have a Starlight Express Room torch?



If so, be aware that it is powered by alkaline button batteries that present a significant potential safety threat to children.

Button batteries (also called coin batteries) can be swallowed by children, and this may result in significant injury. An industry Code for Consumer Goods that contain Button Batteries has been developed by a range of businesses with support from the ACCC and state consumer regulators.
